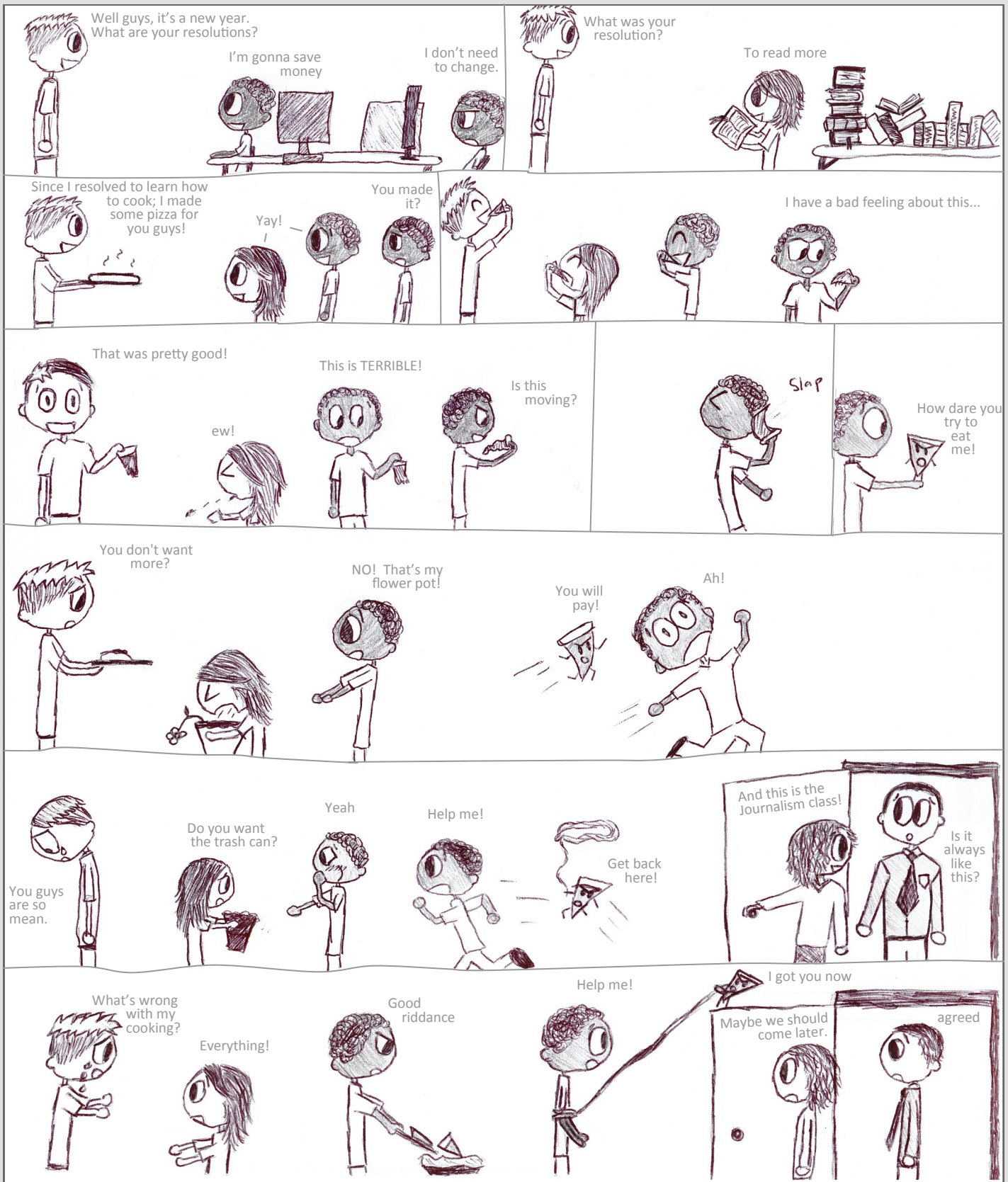
## Otter Pops
